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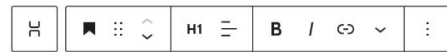

# Usability and accessibility

- Understand user needs – creators are users too!
- Make sure your goals are clear
- Make accessibility approachable for creators
- Include accessibility at all stages, starting with discovery
- Test with real users as much as possible

# Scalability

- Understand available technologies
- Design around what's possible
- Design components instead of pages
- Combine components to customize layouts
- Make it easy to create!

# Color palette picker

To ensure consistency and accessibility across the Harvard Gazette site, we added a custom color palette picker, enabling editors to select text and background colours at the same time from pre-defined palettes.

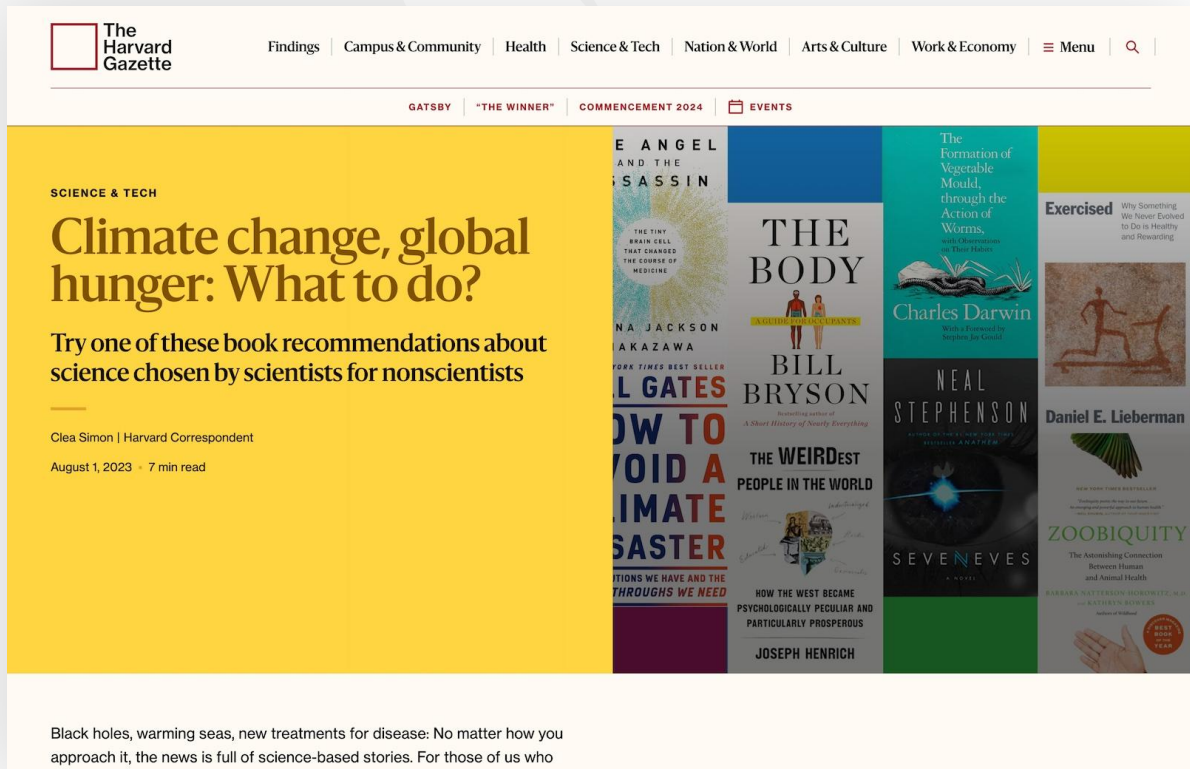

# Article headers

The article header block offers six distinct block styles and advanced display options for article headers. This feature-rich block empowers editors to create visually striking and immersive article layouts.

## Supporting content

Supporting content blocks allow editors to enhance article layouts with images, stats, quotes, and other supplementary content.

This second trial also revealed an intriguing wrinkle. One participant was 11, an age considered outside the optimal range for language acquisition, thought to be from birth to around 6 or 7, Chen said. After hearing was restored, however, the 11-year-old did begin to use single words.

# Image replace on scroll

The image replace on scroll feature dynamically replaces images while scrolling, adding visual interest to article layouts.



**"Orchestrating Impartiality: The Effect of 'Blind' Auditions on Female Musicians" (2000)**

Goldin and co-author Cecilia Rouse examined hiring data before and after the advent of "blind" auditions. They found the set-up increased the proportion of women in professional U.S. orchestras.

**"The Power of the Pill: Oral Contraceptives and Women's Career and Marriage Decisions" (2002)**

Goldin and co-author Lawrence F. Katz found oral contraception had enabled more women to invest in education while holding off on family formation.

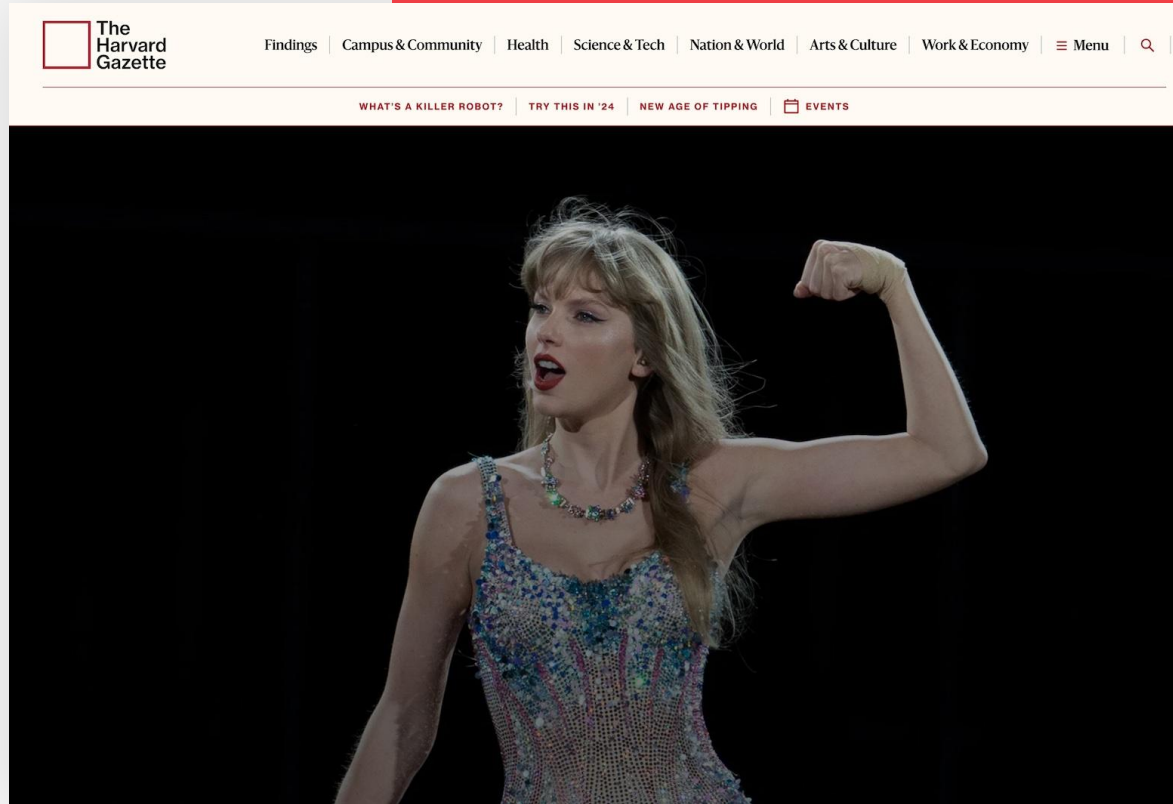
**"The U-Shaped Female Labor Force Function in Economic Development and Economic History" (1994)**

Goldin traced the fall and subsequent rise of female labor force participation in dozens of countries as their economies advanced over two centuries.

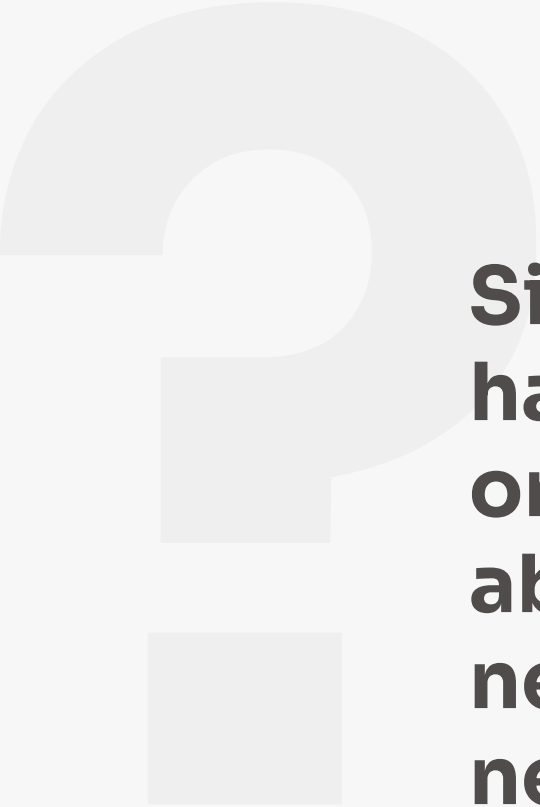
